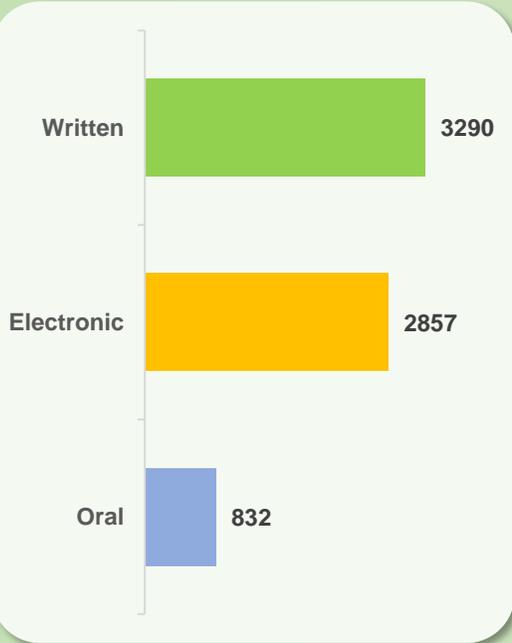


**Commentary on the Work Carried Out in Handling

During 2025, a total of **6,979 appeals** were received by “Ipoteka-bank” ATIB from representatives of individuals and legal entities. Specifically, the distribution of appeals was as follows:

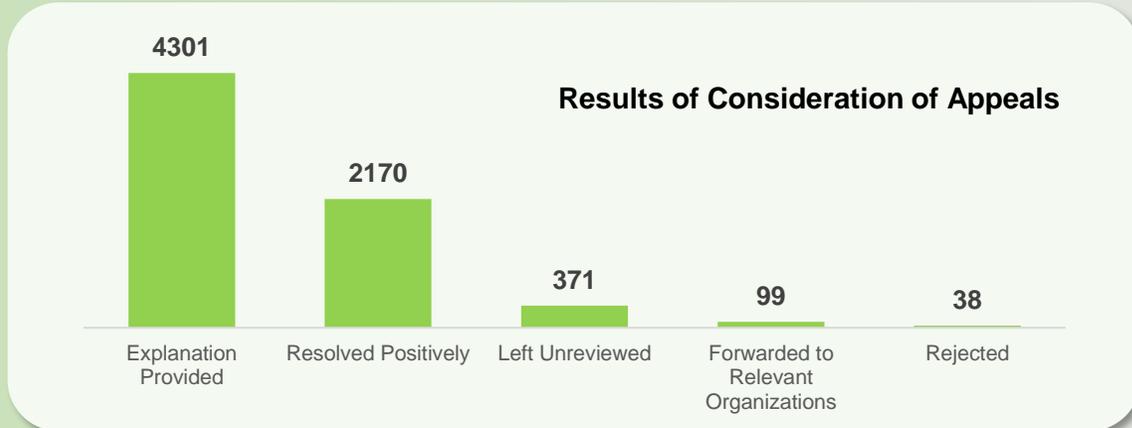
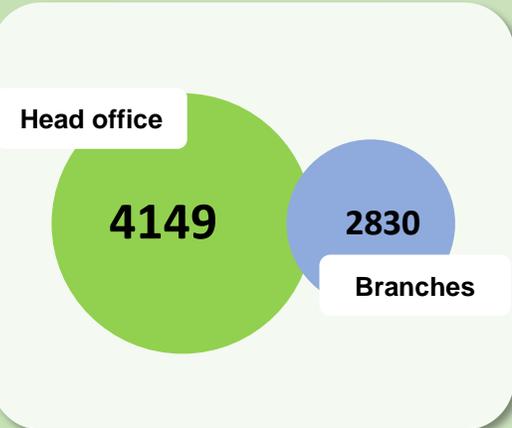
- 4,149 reviewed by the Head Office
- 2,830 reviewed by branches

By type of applicant:

- 6,290 (90%) from individuals
- 689 (10%) from representatives of legal entities

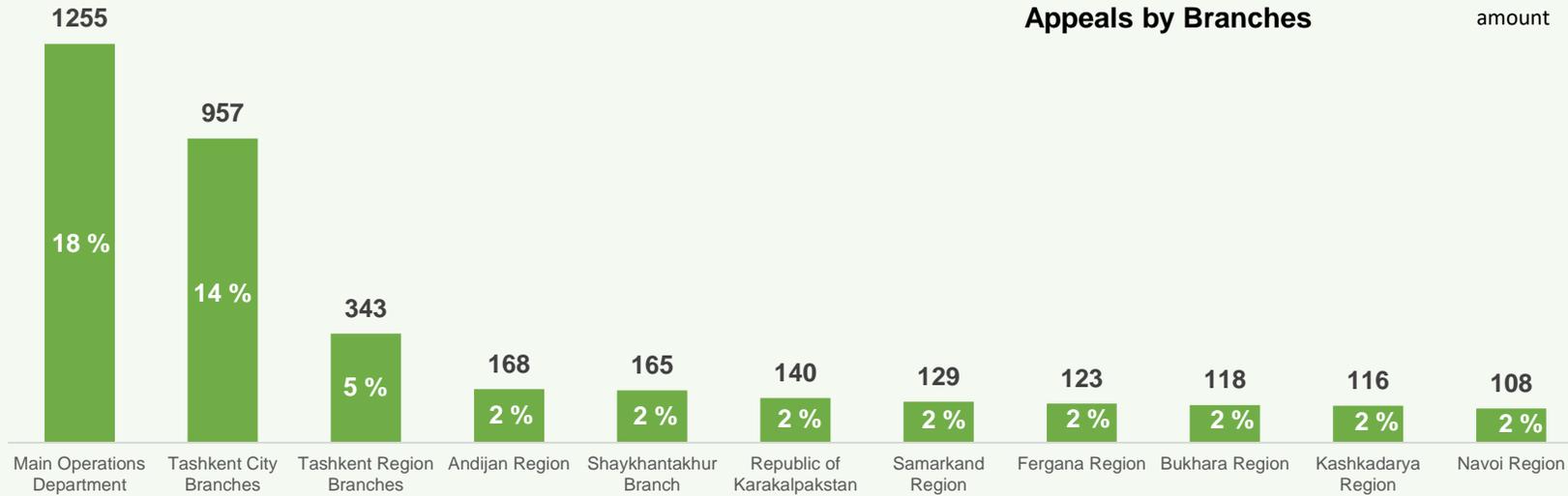
Furthermore, based on the results of consideration:

- 4,301 were provided with explanations within the framework of legislation
- 2,170 were resolved positively
- 371 (closed due to applicant’s request or other circumstances, considered anonymous) were left unreviewed
- 99 were forwarded to relevant organizations
- 38 were rejected

It can be observed that the majority of appeals correspond to the following bank branches, including:

- 1,255 – Main Operations Department
- 957 – Tashkent City Branches
- 343 – Tashkent Region Branches
- 168 – Andijan Region
- 165 – Shaykhantakhur Branch
- 140 – Republic of Karakalpakstan
- 129 – Samarkand Region
- 123 – Fergana Region
- 118 – Bukhara Region
- 116 – Kashkadarya Region
- 108 – Navoi Region

In **3,936 cases**, other issues were raised (branches, payment requests, inquiries regarding account numbers, state programs, and other matters).



Out of a total of 6,979 appeals, 3,615 (47%) correspond to other branches.
